Floating Through Time In Germany, Switzerland and France

The National Balloon Museum has built a tour to include the first balloon museum (Chateau De Balleroy), the Zeppelin Museum and factory, and a ride in a zeppelin. We have added area interests from Switzerland, Germany, and France that are part of the package with many possible side trips. We are putting it out to the Ballooning community and any interested persons. Our deadline for signing up is April 25th, 2008. We scheduled it between the National Balloon Classic and the Albuquerque Fiesta so that all the balloonists wouldn't be affected. The prices for rooms are set-up for double occupancy. Please let us know if you have any interest in joining us on this tour. We will try to answer any of your questions.

September 11 - 25, 2008

- Day 1: Your journey begins in Des Moines as you board your overnight flight to Munich
- Day 2: Arrival in Munich. Make your way to the hotel and enjoy the city.
- Day 3: After breakfast you will take in the sites of Munich on a double- decker bus Hop on Hop off tour. Spend your day discovering the Palace of Nymphenburg, the former summer residence of the Bavarian Princes and Kings. Visit the Olympic grounds where you will find other attractions like Sea Life, the BMW museum and the new BMW car world. Enjoy a fantastic panoramic view from the top of the 290 meter high artist quarter of Schwabing where you may stroll along Leopold Street.
- Day 4: Day at leisure or optional tour of the Royal Castles Neuschwanstein and Linderhof. If you take this tour you will visit two of Ludwigs II's dream castles in the heart of the Bavarian Alps.
- Day 5: Today you are off by train to Friedrichshafen to tour the Zeppelin museum and factory.
- Day 6: Take in the sites of Lake Constance and an optional Zeppelin flight. 30 minute flight over Friedrichshafen \$292.00 per person. 1 hour flight around Lake Constance \$519.00 per person
- Day 7: Travel by train to Zurich, Switzerland the rest of the day is yours to explore.
- Day8: Take a step back in time as you travel to Lucerne. After a panoramic tour of the town you will proceed to a typical Old Town Restaurant where traditional Swiss dishes will be served. You will start with a cheese

Fondue, followed by a hearty bratwurst and a delicious dessert. During lunch you will be entertained with yodeling, singing, alp horn-blowing and flag-throwing. After lunch take time and explore Lucerne before your return to Zurich.

- Day 9: Day at leisure or optional tour of the Appenzellerland and a chocolate factory. This tour takes you on a journey where old traditions are still alive. Learn the art of making chocolate and observe the traditional way of cheese making.
- Day 10: Back on board the train you will travel to Caen, France. Relax and enjoy the scenery.
- Day 11: Spend today at The Chateau De Balleroy. Wander through the Chateau and explore one of the very first balloon museums.
- Day 12: Day at leisure with optional tours to museums and Normandy beaches.
- Day 13: Take the train to Paris and enjoy the day wandering the Champs Elysees or visiting the Louvre.
- Day 14: Today you will experience Paris starting with a 2 hour tour with an escorted driver. You will see the Champs-Elysees, the Arc de Triumph, Concorde Square, the Invalides, the Eiffel Tower, the Trocadero, the Opera, Notre Dame Cathedral, the Louvre Museum, Orsay Museum, Madeliene Church and many more. After having shown you the key spots of Paris, you will be taken for lunch at restaurant/cafeteria Café Seine, where there will be a table reserved for you. You will then embark a delightful cruise along the Seine, offering you a fantastic opportunity to take in the sights of Paris, from the famous river. Your tour will terminate at the foot of the Eiffel Tower. The rest of your day is at leisure.

FAA Mandates Plastic Pilot Certificates

Still hanging onto your paper pilot certificate? You'll need to upgrade to a plastic pilot certificate by March 31, 2010. The FAA released its final rule on Feb. 28, announcing the required switch to the certificate it deems is more counterfeit resistant.

If you are attached to your paper certificate and original issuance date (the plastic certificate will have a new one), don't worry. You can keep your paper certificate for nostalgia; you just can't use it to fly. If you do miss the 2010 deadline, you won't have to take a checkride or any exams to get back in the air as pilot in command. Simply request the plastic certificate through the FAA's Web site (http://www.faa.gov/licenses_certificates/airmen_certificat ion/certificate_replacement/) . The cost is \$2. However, if you change your pilot certificate number from your Social Security number, the switch is free.

Temporary, student, and flight instructor certificates are not impacted by this rule. Those with nonpilot certificates, such as ground instructors, flight engineers, and mechanics, will have until March 31, 2013 to change to a plastic certificate.

Pilots can request the plastic certificate Because the FAA is currently processing replacement certificate for pilots who fly internationally to meet the "English proficient" endorsement, pilots might want to wait a few weeks before requesting a plastic certificate to prevent a backlog.

25 years ago in BOI History:

- ★ March 26-27 Ground School. Cost \$50 (\$25 for 2nd family member)
- ★ April 16 Ode to Spring & FFA Safety Meeting.
- ★ 3-13-1983 Ralph Rieck received his Private license.
- ☆ 3-19 & 20, 1983 BOI Initiation: The annual initiation of new members into Balloons Over Iowa was conducted the evening of Saturday, March 19 and the morning of Sunday, March 20. Initiation rites were conducted by Messieurs Boettcher, Griffin, Bartholomew, King and Prine in an environment characterized by great solemnity and little sobriety - or visa versa. A smashing time was had by all, particularly Paul Randleman, who as I understand is home now and appreciates all the cards and letters. Rabbi Boettcher conducted the ceremony wearing a flowing off white habit discarded by a defrocked monk and was assisted by King and Prine, who were semi formally attired. Bartholomew and Griffin directed the initiates through the complex and intricate occasion to a new and rhythmic chant, discovered by them sometime earlier in the evening, of "pinch-pinchy". The highlight of the evening occurred, after Paul Randleman regained consciousness, when a unanimous ballot was cast for Ted Mart as recipient of the most prestigious Tucker Comstock Award.

Breaking the Sound Barrier Without an Airplane

Joe Kittinger is not a household aviation name like Neil Armstrong or Chuck Yeager. But what he did for the U. S. space program is comparable. On Aug. 16, 1960, as research for the then-fledgling U. S. space program, Air Force Captain Joseph Kittinger rode a helium balloon to the edge of space, 102,800 feet above the earth, a feat in itself. Then, wearing just a thin pressure suit and breathing supplemental oxygen, he leaned over the cramped confines of his gondola and jumped--into the 110-degree-below-zero, near-vacuum of space.

Within seconds his body accelerated to 714mph in the thin air, breaking the sound barrier. After free-falling for more than four and a half minutes, slowed finally by friction from the heavier air below, he felt his parachute open at 14,000 feet, and he coasted gently down to the New Mexico desert floor.

Kittinger's feat showed scientists that astronauts could survive the harshness of space with just a pressure suit and that man could eject from aircraft at extreme altitudes and survive. Upon Kittinger's return to base, a congratulatory telegram was waiting from the Mercury seven astronauts--including Alan Shepard and John Glenn. More than four decades later Kittinger's two world records--the highest parachute jump, and the only man to break the sound barrier without an aircraft and live--still stand. We decided to visit the retired colonel and Aviation Hall of Famer, now 75, at his home in Altamonte Springs, Florida, to recall his historic jump.

FORBES GLOBAL: Take us back to New Mexico and Aug. 16, 1960.

Joe Kittinger: We got up at 2 a. m. to start filling the helium balloon. At sea level, it was 35 to 40 feet wide and 200 feet high; at altitude, due to the low air pressure, it expanded to 25 stories in width, and still was 20 stories high! At 4 a. m. I began breathing pure oxygen for two hours. That's how long it takes to remove all the nitrogen from your blood so you don't get the bends going so high so fast. Then it was a lengthy dress procedure layering warm clothing under my pressure suit. They kept me in air-conditioning until it was time to launch because we were in the desert and I wasn't supposed to sweat. If I did, my clothes would freeze on the way up.

How was your ascent? It took an hour and a half to get to altitude. It was cold. At 40,000 feet, the glove on my right hand hadn't inflated. I knew that if I radioed my doctor, he would abort the flight. If that happened, I knew I might never get another chance because there were lots of people who didn't want this test to happen. I took a calculated risk, that I might lose use of my right hand. It quickly swelled up, and I did lose use for the duration of the flight. But the rest of the pressure suit worked. When I reached 102,800 feet, maximum altitude, I wasn't quite over the target. So I drifted for 11 minutes. The winds were out of the east.

What's it look like from so high up? You can see about 400 miles in every direction. The formula is 1.25 x the sq. root of the altitude in thousands of feet. (The square root of 102,000 ft is $319 \times 1.25 = 399$ miles) The most fascinating thing is that it's just black overhead--the transition from normal blue to black is very stark. You can't see stars because there's a lot of glare from the sun, so your pupils are too small. I was struck with the beauty of it. But I was also struck by how hostile it is: more than 100 degrees below zero, no air. If my protection suit failed, I would be dead in a few seconds. Blood actually boils above 62, 000 feet. I went through my 46-step checklist, disconnected from the balloon's power supply and lost all communication with the ground. I was totally under power from the kit on my back. When everything was done, I stood up, turned around to the door, took one final look out and said a silent prayer: "Lord, take care of me now." Then I just jumped over the side.

What were you thinking as you took that step? It's the beginning of a test. I had gone through simulations many times--more than 100. I rolled over and looked up, and there was the balloon just roaring into space. I realized that the balloon wasn't roaring into space; I was going down at a fantastic rate! At about 90,000 feet, I reached 714mph. The altimeter on my wrist was unwinding very rapidly. But there was no sense of speed. Where you determine speed is visual--if you see something go flashing by. But nothing flashes by 20 miles up--there are no signposts there, and you are way above any clouds. When the chute opened, the rest of the jump was anticlimactic because everything had worked perfectly. I landed 12 or 13 minutes later, and there was my crew waiting. We were elated.

How about your right hand? It hurt--there was quite a bit of swelling and the blood pressure in my arm was high. But that went away in a few days, and I regained full use of my hand.

What about attempts to break your record? We did it for air crews and astronauts--for the learning, not to set a record. They will be going up as skydivers. Somebody will beat it someday. Records are made to be broken. And I'll be

elated. But I'll also be concerned that they're properly trained. If they're not, they're taking a heck of a risk.

BOI Club Information

I was recently contacted by Kathy Thompson of the NE Ohio Balloon Pilots Organization. She is putting together a segment for the National Balloon Convention on Balloon Clubs. She requested a variety of information on our club. I replied, then shared my reply at the next BOI meeting. Some of the members liked the reply so much that they voted to double my salary if I published the reply in the next newsletter. So here it is - bring on the big money!! Carol

Our club membership is currently 114 family memberships. I currently have 399 on the birthday list, so I would think somewhere in the 400 member range would be close to accurate. I don't have a specific list of pilots, but counted out 92 and some families are multiple pilot families, so probably around 100 pilots. We have members from 9 states, but the majority are from Iowa.

Our club has, for the most part - 2 purposes - social & education. We have 3-4 large social events per year, plus monthly meetings. We have a Ground School every February which attracts students & pilots (for commercial testing) from many surrounding states. One of the ways we attract new members is to provide a yearly membership to the club for all those attending ground school. Ballooning is definitely not dying in Iowa. We normally have 20-40 students at Ground School every year. We have a St. Patrick's party with initiation of new members, Irish Stew cook-off & appearances by the Giant Leprechauns (an event not to be missed). In April is Ode to Spring - the first Iowa flying event of the year in which members come to fly, renew memberships, gather for a pot luck, appoint new board members, and present club awards. We, along with the other club in Iowa sponsor a tailgate event/party the last night of the National Balloon Classic in August. Then, we end the year with a Halloween party - pumpkin carving contest, chili cookoff, potluck, costume awards, etc. We meet monthly, unless it's flyable, then we all go fly.

BOI was formed in 1978 by the 5 we now refer to as "Founding Fathers". We celebrated the 25 year anniversary in 2003. We've never really had a problem with membership & no one worries too much about the future - every year Ground School seems to come off (run entirely by members who volunteer their time) and our social events continue to be popular.

Structurally, our club is pretty loosely run. Our President for life is Meika Bartholomew. She & our Vice President -Sandy Drake, are both dogs. Meika belongs to one of the Founding Fathers - Rob Bartholomew and Sandy belongs to long time member Dick Drake. They both write articles for the bi-monthly newsletter (they're quite smart for dogs) and make like they run the club. The Founding Fathers choose 5 members to be on the Board of Directors for the club - no election, or any political maneuvering - they're just told they are on the board for the year. Only 2 or 3 members have been on the board for a second term, they've always been able to find new members to fill the positions. The board really has no power, either, they just chair the monthly meetings. Our club has only 1 rule "There are no rules!". No by-laws. We don't vote Yay or Nay at meetings, we vote "Okey-dokey" or "Not a chance". Sounds too simple to work, but it does work. We don't have a landowner program and our dues are \$20 per family.

Most balloonists in the state belong to both balloon clubs. They have the annual Safety Seminar, we have the Ground School. We each put out newsletters, alternating months. Since many balloonists from Illinois, Wisconsin, Nebraska, Minnesota, Missouri, etc come to Ground School, Safety Seminar, and local balloon events, the memberships of both clubs as well as many friendships cross state lines.

Congratulations to Rich Jaworski. Rich recently completed another record setting flight. He flew 19 hrs and 3 minutes, which did not beat his record setting flight of last year, but covered 250 miles, breaking the AX-4 <u>distance</u> record.

Rich Jaworski landed "Adventure of the Heart" on the frozen surface of Big Doctor Lake, just outside of Siren, WI at around 4:30 am.

Rule Places Time Limit on Aircraft Transaction Paperwork

If you're planning to sell your aircraft, be aware of a new FAA rule. Effective March 31, once you sell or transfer your aircraft to a new owner, you have 21 calendar days to complete the information on the back of your registration card and return it to the FAA. The agency had proposed to set a five-day time limit, but after AOPA objected to this unrealistic requirement, the FAA adopted the 21-day rule. In addition, the FAA is also requiring that requests for new aircraft registration include typed or printed names along with signatures. The mandate is part of the FAA's Drug Enforcement Assistance Act, in which the agency is working to keep the U.S. aircraft registry up to date.

Know Your Fellow Balloonists
