The Way It Was

30 years ago in BOI History:

- August 1978 Nationals: Lawrence Burns "The Flying Father" & John J. Johnson of Mason City were among the 150 that launched in a mass ascension. Governor Ray flew in "Midnight" piloted by Rob Bartholomew. Mrs. Ray flew in "Archway" piloted by Dale Points; Balloonmeister was Tom Sheppard; Event results #1 Sid Cutter, #2 Harold Carter, #3 Jeff Thompson, #13 J.J. Johnson, #23 Rob Bartholomew; Article in DM Register about 18 year old Jeff Thompson, flying "Blue Max". Jeff placed third in the competition; BFA adopted a resolution providing for the National Hot Air Balloon Championships to be held in perpetuity at Indianola, unless an 18 month notice is first given
- This is the 9th year Nationals have been held in Indianola. The preliminary's were held in Indianola in 1970 with the finals at the Iowa State Fair. 11 balloons participated in that first event. 17 participated in 1971; 42 in 1972; 86 in 1973; 168 in 1974; 199 in 1975; 215 in 1976 and 182 in 1977. 210 participated this year.

25 years ago in BOI History:

- ★ July 1983 110 Competitive & 100 Non-competitive Pilots expected at Nationals. BOI members erected the fencing around & about Simpson College.
- ★ 7-24 Elaine Lawrence received her Commercial license.
- * 1983 Nationals: Quote from an article in the DM Register "Rob Bartholomew, a Carlisle farmer who has evolved into the Luke Skywalker of Iowa balloonists". Rob is quoted - "Back when I started there were maybe five or six pilots in the state. Now there's probably 100." 60 Iowa pilots competed at the Nationals; #1 - Owen Keown #2 – David Levin, #3 – Phil Glebe, #4 – Dave Schaffer, #5 – Rob Bartholomew. Balloonmeister – Jim Birk; Pat Barz of Colorado was named the new president of the BFA – the organization's first woman president; Special Shapes – Mr. Peanut & The Flying Chateau; Leo Eisenberg donated \$100,000 to the National Balloon Museum. This gift was a catalyst for a fund-raising campaign for the construction of a new museum.

20 years ago in BOI History:

- ★ July '88 Thom Roberts, photographer died suddenly of a heart attack. Pictorial remembrance of him & his love of ballooning in the National Balloon Museum.
- ★ 7-10 Joyce Blevins received her Commercial license.
- ★ August '88 National Balloon Museum opens.
- ★ August '88 Report of Ballooning trip to Australia by Donna Rieck. The original plan to pack the balloon into a van & ship it all to Australia would have forced them to refinance the house, cash in all the life insurance policies, sell the car & start selling themselves on the streets. Those traveling with Ralph & Donna included Carl Young, Cathy Jensen, Laurie Allbaugh & Ken Allbaugh. Donna reported that the winds were so strong in Perth, that the indoor pool had whitecaps on it!
- ★ 1988 National Championship 18th and final US National Hot Air Balloon Championship to be held in Indianola. The Championship will move to Baton Rouge, LA for the next 3 years; 12 tasks flown; David Levin grabbed a pole for \$10,000; Marlene Wall was the Event Coordinator, Nick Saum was the championship director; Willard Scott from NBC's "Today Show" broadcast live from the launch field; Rob Bartholomew, flying the familiar yellow balloon with the black zig-zag, known at "Charlie Brown" won with 10,059 points 352 more than #2 Bruce Comstock. Rob was the first Iowa pilot to win the Nationals.
- ★ 1988 Iowa Championship: #1 Ralph Rieck, #2 Gordon Acuff, #3 Dennis Cox & Steve Hoover, #5 Dan Terry, #6 Dennis Tiege, #7 Wayne Wasson & Jim Oakes, #9 Royce Pierson, #10 Norm Dockstader.

15 years ago in BOI History:

- ★ July 18, 1993 BOI Meeting: \$1,568.55 in treasury.
- ★ July newsletter: Interview with Classic Balloonmeister Rob Bartholomew Due to the recent floods & heavy rains, fields & waterways are wet choose your landing spots carefully.

- ★ National Balloon Classic July 30 Aug 8 1993 Balloonmeister Rob Bartholomew; Executive Director Chris Goodale; 12 flights, 22 tasks; 8-7 2nd Annual Dick Drake Duck Drop; Jim Pearson's crew Crew of the Year; Special shapes: Hog Heaven, Case International Tractor, United Van Lines Truck, Balloon Hilda and Hagar the Horrible; 3 balloons retired Rainbow Connection (Ongs) Mnementh (Prines) & Whispering Blue (Fromms); 1st Place Bill Clemons, 2nd Becky Petrehn, 3rd Jim Fromm, 6th Jim Thompson, 7th Sherry Allsup, 8th Ralph Rieck. Bill sat out the 1992 event while he and wife Louise built a balloon
- ★ August 15, 1993 BOI Meeting: \$15,68.55 in treasury; Jill Rubin has ordered a balloon & will become a pilot to be trained by Wayne Wasson; Ground school to be held in October; Paul Randleman is to be the BOI representative to NBC's Pilot Relations Board; a cookout was held after the meeting.
- * All Iowa Championships Osky; 30 pilots, 1 flight; IBA Crew of the Year Joy Pearson; IBA Balloonist of the Year Sherry Allsup.





Sioux Falls Balloon Race

The weather heading into the second weekend in June was less than ideal, not allowing for a media flight in the several days prior to the 33rd annual Great Plains Balloon Race. On Friday night, pilots rolled into town for the check-in party. The weather was looking good for a flight on Saturday morning, despite the relatively fast winds aloft. Saturday evening was sketchy though, with scattered thunderstorms expected by midafternoon.

Saturday morning rolled around much faster than many would have liked, with a 3 am wake up call for many who volunteered to help John Ninomiya with his cluster balloon. This was John's third attempt at flying at the Great Plains Balloon event, hopefully the third time was the charm. Despite the 30 mph winds forecast at 500 feet and weak thunderstorms well to the north of Sioux Falls, the decision was made to attempt a flight. Surface winds were gusty out of the southwest around 5-7 mph, making the inflation somewhat difficult. As the sun rose, the line of showers to our north became When I called the local National more evident. Weather Service office to get an update on the showers, I found out the showers were in their dissipating stage and were expected to stay well to the north and east of Sioux Falls. As sunrise approached, the surface winds dropped off to near calm and I called the office for one final briefing. At this time, I found out the showers had produced several outflow boundaries that were headed towards the Sioux Falls metro area. Fortunately the boundaries were not all that strong, causing surface winds to temporarily gust up to 10-12 mph out of the north. John Ninomiya launched right at sunrise, and as he continued to climb, it became evident that the brisk winds were still there aloft. Given that the outflow boundaries were relatively weak, a hare and hound event was called with Bill Kullander serving as the hare. Just as he went hot, an outflow boundary moved through and caused an abrupt wind shift out of the north. Bill quickly took off heading south, while John, who was now well aloft, headed east. Before long, the

hounds followed, taking to the sky one by one. With time, the winds continued to decrease behind the front, eventually changing back to the overall southwest to northeast flow. Because of the changing wind conditions, the only balloons that made it to the target were the first few off the ground. Congratulations to Bill Clemons, Matthew Grote and Vern Feekes for finishing first, second, and third respectfully.

As the day wore on, it became more and more evident that the low-level moisture was going to stay further south in central Iowa (where they certainly did not need the rain), and the chances of pulling off a flight were looking pretty good. As pilots and crew began gathering at the field, the winds were a bit gusty out of the west with temperatures in the lower 80s. As the thermals subsided, the gusty conditions rapidly subsided and a light west wind around 3 mph prevailed. A second hare and hound was called, with Bill Kullander serving once again as the hare. He took to the sky around 7:30 pm, with everyone following shortly behind. Bill caught a wind to take him to the east north-east, while the hounds remained on a due east if not a southeast heading. Winds continued to decrease towards sunset, approaching calm causing many to walk their balloons to suitable landing spots. Because of the varying wind directions between the hare and the hounds, no one was able to get remotely close to the target allowing the morning results to stand. Congratulations again to Bill Clemons, Matthew Grote and Vern Feekes for displaying great piloting skills and making it to the target Saturday morning. Hope to see everyone at the 34th annual Great Plains Balloon Race June 12-14th, 2009.

23rd Annual Mayor's Invitational Balloon Race

Rochester, MN

The outlook for ballooning the last weekend in June was far from optimistic with a strong area of low pressure across southern Canada creating strong winds across the northern plains. Despite the bleak outlook, nearly 30 pilots converged on Rochester, MN to make the best of the hand Mother Nature dealt.

The event was held at a new location this year, at a

soccer complex on the edge of a relatively new housing development on the far northwest side of Rochester. For those that have not been to Rochester before, the town is located 5-6 miles north of Interstate 90 with the airport situated just north of the Interstate. Being that we were on the north side of town, there was a good buffer between the balloon field and the airport. Along with the new location, a few different events were planned as well. Instead of a scheduled flight Friday night, a night glow was scheduled. A key grab for a new Harley was scheduled on Saturday night, with a rain/wind date of Sunday morning. Friday night winds were quite strong out of the south, so the balloon glow was cancelled and a field of fire was held instead.

Saturday morning winds were brisk, with 30-35 mph winds just off the surface. With winds at the surface holding steady around 8 to 10 mph, the task was cancelled but the field was opened to pilots who wanted to squeak a flight in. Five pilots elected to fly, covering 20 miles in 40 minutes. Despite the shallow inversion separating the strong winds aloft from the surface, a few pilots were able to have stand-up landings.

Scattered thunderstorms developed during the late morning hours and continued into the afternoon hours. Pilots gathered at the field Saturday night with ominous clouds on the horizon to the west. The decision was made to wait it out, and if it was not raining at 7:30, a field of fire would be held. Periods of sprinkles moves through the northwest side of town in the interim, while light rain covered the town of Rochester and areas south. As sunset approached, the rain to the north died away and a few pilots set up their baskets for the field of fire. Winds in the Rochester area were not all that strong hanging around 5 mph, but just 50-60 miles to the west winds were gusting 35-45 mph behind a strong cold front marching east. As the clouds began to collapse, a few of the pilots who flew decided to set up to dry out their envelopes. As the front's progression became slower and slower to the east, additional balloons set up to night glow. In total, eight balloons set up and night glowed for nearly an hour.

Overnight, the front moved through the area putting to end any remote chances of flying Sunday morning. For the second time in the event's history, Mother Nature had won, not allowing for a competitive flight throughout the weekend. At the awards brunch, the first place cup (which can be seen at http://www.mayorscupballoonrace.com/thecup.htm) was presented to Mother Nature. The first place champagne glasses were presented to Kevin Knapp for traveling farther than any other pilot to attend the event. The last place trophy, which is also a cup (of another kind), was presented to the meteorologist for the event because of all the crummy weather throughout the weekend. Heres to better weather in 2009!
