The poster will be on display at the Museum during the tour and at the Museum's booth at the convention. Later it will be framed and hung at the Museum.

- ★ 4-20-1980 Jim Oakes received his Private license.
- ★ 4-25-1980 Warren Stone received his Private license.
- ★ Ode 1980 won by Orv Olivia a balloonist who was driving through Iowa on his way to South Carolina & stopped to join us when he saw the balloons.

25 years ago in BOI History:

- ★ 3-10-1985 Wayne Wasson received his Commercial license.
- ★ April 27 Ode to Spring at Piccard Park. 1985 Crew of the Year Tom Harvey, Jim Love, Darlene Terry. 39 Hot-Air Balloons floated in the sky in pursuit of that elusive Bunny Rabbit as a Hare and Hound was run for Sanctioned flight. The Bunny Rabbit out foxed the Hounds by going high on take off and then working the winds to the best of his ability. New BOI Board Members for 85-86: Jim Oakes, Fay Shelley, Becky Riley, Doug Purdy, and Gary Fouche.

20 years ago in BOI History:

- ★ 3-24-1990 Jim Fromm received his Commercial license.
- ★ 4-15-90 BOI Meeting: Don Prine to present a flag to the balloon museum at Ode; Donna Rieck named as secretary for the following year
- ★ 1990 Ode to Spring: 12th Annual; it was Flyable! Jim Oakes was Balloonmeister. It was a slow easy race with a launch site at the new balloon field and a target east of Warren Stone's. Those who took off soon after the pilot briefing missed the field to the east, but those launching later flew right over the field, but the scorers had rolled up the X & headed for the Balloonport for the "Pot Luck" of the year. The 1989 board of Louise Clemons, Jim Fromm, Sally Kirtley, Merrie Fouche & Ralph Rieck will long be remembered as the Board to start the "Ponderances", "Okey-Dokey & Not-a Chance" forms of voting). The board for 1990 was then introduced - Bill Clemons, Rita Fromm, Jeri Hoover, Georgia Oakes, Mark Ziino. Cleo Award - Rob Bartholomew. Pilot of the Year – Jim Oakes. Crew of the Year – Bartholomew & Craig crews – Bob, Helen, Denny, Lynn, Bill, Brad, Michelle. Ode to Spring winners - #1 Mark Ziino, #2 Don Prine #3 Warren Stone. BOI presented a US flag to Jim & Maxine Wieman to be flown at the National Balloon Museum.

15 years ago in BOI History:

- ★ March '95 Norm & Kay Fee's new balloon -Tranquility
- ★ St. Pat's day party: Irish Stew Cook-off Sherry Allsup first place, second place to Virginia Van Hamme, 3rd place to Bill Griffin. New members included Mike & Beth Oberman, Todd & DeanAnn Netley, Julie Frueh, Brent Hess, Shannon Smith, Jim Pearson, Mason Fromm, & the Stone family. Again the leprechauns became rowdy. New event the "Night Glow Pibal"; Members oohed & aahed over the launch of a "Night glow pibal" a pibal with a 2 ft. sparkler attached to the bottom of the balloon, then danced to tunes from the new juke box.

One pilot disqualified for not signing the official paperwork. 1st place Winkenwerders, 2nd place -Drakes. Sherry & Red Allsup presented an autographed picture of Sherry's balloon Moonshine to Rob & Linda. They will be moving to Arizona after the Classic. Cleo Award – Founding Father Don Prine Pilot of the Year – Joel Blom for impersonating Balloon Watcher Bob. Crew of the Year - Mike, Beth, April & Tony Oberman. New board - Jim Pearson, Julie Frueh, Todd Netley, Mike Oberman, Mike Wildung

Flying at 75 Miles Per Hour

If you think about flying a hot air balloon faster than the speed limit on Iowa highways, it sounds crazy. But that is what I did during a long jump on January 29, 2011. It may seem like it would be a breathtaking, exhilarating experience. The view from 12,000 ft. was very breathtaking, although since I had no point of reference to judge my speed, it didn't seem any different than going 5 mph at a few hundred feet above the earth.

This flight had the potential of a low and slow flight. Since I was interested in multiple distances of long jumps. I felt I will use this flight to continue to gather data on my system, personal equipment, and other physical aspects of these flights. The forecast was a low ceiling with potential for snow by mid-afternoon. Due to strong forecast winds at sunup, I chose an 11:00 am launch time. With a great protected launch site, winds were 4 mph at takeoff. I started southwest for a mile at 10mph then south and finally southeast. For the first 40 minutes the winds were in the low 20 mph's with a ceiling of about 7,000 ft. and behind me were approaching clouds at 3,000 ft. It was looking like I would have be going very low very soon. Ahead of me there showed a promise of some clearing. Gradually the sky did open up and I felt I may only have a short window of time to go up and find stronger winds. Not only did I have a window, the sky cleared and the rest of the flight was in beautifully blue skies. I proceeded to climb and so did my speed. Watching my GPS I noticed the speed, 30, 40, now 50mph. "Boy this is great," I thought. I had been to 10,900 ft. on my previous flight, so I though why not 12,000 ft. Then I saw 60 mph and for a time 68 mph was a top speed. I thought, "If I could just find 2 more mph, that would be awesome". I did reach 12,000 ft. and 70 mph. I was flying steady in the low 70 mphs, and I noticed the GPS register a top speed of 75.2 mph. I stayed with these speeds until my last tank reminded me that the fun was coming to an end. So with a gradual descent, I found a wind speeds to be less than 5mph on the surface. I found a landing site and gently set it down. It is quite a sight to see towns and roads moving that quickly underneath you, not to mention you

outrun your ground crew. Speed was never a concern. As long as your envelope is pressurized, the transition between speeds will be smooth. I would love the experience of 100-120 mph someday.

NTSB Identification: WPR10LA161

Monday, March 15, 2010 in Phoenix, AZ HEAD BALLOONS INC AX9 118, registration: N3087D Injuries: 1 Serious, 4 Minor, 1 Uninjured.

This is preliminary information, subject to change, and may contain errors. Any errors in this report will be corrected when the final report has been completed. On March 15, 2010, about 1807 mountain standard time, a Head Balloons, Inc., AX9 118, N3087D, made a hard, bounced, high wind landing in an open field about 5.5 miles northwest of the Deer Valley Airport, Phoenix, Arizona. During landing, the balloon's basket impacted uneven rocky terrain and tipped over. Several panels in the balloon's envelope were ripped open, and the balloon was substantially damaged. The commercial certificated pilot was seriously injured. One of the 3 child passengers and both of their parents sustained minor injuries. The fare-paying passengers had contracted with Arizona Hot Air Balloons, Inc., Phoenix, for their anticipated hour-long sightseeing flight. Visual meteorological conditions prevailed, and no flight plan had been filed. The flight was performed under 14 Code of Federal Regulations Part 91, and it originated from a field in northern Phoenix about 1730.

Information received from responding emergency personnel, the owner of Arizona Hot Air Balloons and his ground recovery crew, passengers, and Federal Aviation Administration inspectors, revealed that the pilot elected to terminate the flight earlier than planned when the local wind speed increased. The pilot communicated to her ground crew via radio that she intended to land, and she advised her passengers that the landing would likely involve one or more bounces. Reportedly, the touchdown was hard and the basket bounced as it encountered rocks while dragging in the soil. The pilot attempted to rapidly deflate the envelope by pulling on the red line to expedite the hot air venting process. The envelope did not promptly deflate. Although the pilot was ejected, she held on to the red line while being dragged about 100 yards. The envelope eventually collided with a roadside crossing gate and came to rest.

During the FAA inspectors' subsequent examination of the balloon, they reported observing two airworthiness certificates bearing different registration numbers, along with a flight manual that did not pertain to the accident balloon envelope, and unused safety helmets. The passengers reported they had not been offered use of the helmets. One of the passengers sustained a head injury while exiting the balloon's basket.

The balloon is undergoing an examination for airworthiness anomalies related to the functionality of its deflation system and to its preimpact integrity.

Wednesday, March 17, 2010 in San Diego, CA Aircraft: ULTRAMAGIC S-160, registration: N30048 Injuries: 3 Serious, 6 Uninjured.

This is preliminary information, subject to change, and may

contain errors. Any errors in this report will be corrected when the final report has been completed.

On March 17, 2010, at approximately 1855 Pacific daylight time, an Ultramagic S-160 balloon, N30048, sustained substantial damage when it landed hard near San Diego, California. The commercial pilot and five passengers were not injured; however, three passengers received serious injuries. Panorama Balloon Tours was operating the balloon under the provisions of 14 Code of Federal Regulations Part 91. Visual meteorological conditions prevailed for the commercial air tour flight, which originated approximately 55 minutes before the accident. A flight plan had not been filed.

The pilot reported that as the flight progressed, the wind moving the balloon gradually decreased. He had selected a landing spot, but needed to cross over some high power transmission wires. The pilot reported that the balloon's three burners failed to produce their full power and he elected to land short of the power lines. In order to avoid drifting into the power lines, he pulled the top out of the envelope and the balloon landed hard. The envelope snagged on several trees resulting in substantial damage.

Friday, April 02, 2010 in Durhamville, NY Probable Cause Approval Date: 8/12/2010 Aircraft: FIREFLY AX8B, registration: N1514G

Injuries: 1 Serious, 2 Uninjured.

The pilot of the balloon stated that at the conclusion of the 1-hour flight, with two passengers, he conducted a typical landing to a "level, grassy" golf course fairway. During the landing, one of the passengers "lost [her] footing" in the gondola, fell, and slid into the pilot. The pilot then fell onto the passenger, fracturing her ankle. The pilot did not mention if he gave the passengers a prelanding briefing prior to the landing.

The National Transportation Safety Board determines the probable cause(s) of this accident as follows: The passenger's failure to adequately brace herself for the landing.

Saturday, May 15, 2010 in Hilliard, OH Probable Cause Approval Date: 7/22/2010

Aircraft: AEROSTAR INTERNATIONAL S57A,

Injuries: 1 Serious, 2 Uninjured.

After a 50-minute, late afternoon balloon flight, the pilot executed a normal touchdown onto a flat grassy area. A weather station 8 miles to the northeast reported the surface wind was five miles per hour at the time of the accident. All

of the occupants were facing forward for the touchdown and the pilot had previously instructed both passengers how to hold on to two points and how to flex their knees for the first impact of landing. At the first impact with the ground, the 82 year old female passenger sank to the floor of the balloon basket. It was immediately apparent to the other passenger that she had been injured. After the basket stopped moving, the pilot deflated the balloon and the pilot, the other passenger, and a bystander assisted the injured passenger in exiting. The injured passenger was transported to the hospital and treated for a broken leg. The other occupants were not injured and the balloon was not damaged. The uninjured passenger said the pre-takeoff safety briefing and the before landing safety briefing were simple and clearly understood.

The National Transportation Safety Board determines the probable cause(s) of this accident as follows: The passenger's inadequate brace for the balloon landing, resulting in injury.

Friday, June 18, 2010 in Grants Pass, OR Probable Cause Approval Date: 1/7/2011

Aircraft: LINDSTRAND 120A, registration: N501LB

Injuries: 1 Serious, 1 Uninjured.

During the post-landing, pre-deflation portion of a hot air balloon flight, the basket of the balloon began to lift off the ground when one of the individuals holding it released their grip on the top rim of the basket. At that point, the remaining three individuals holding the basket released their grip on the top rim of the basket and the balloon began to ascend. As the basket lifted higher into the air, one of the individuals who had released their grip on the basket top rim grabbed onto the rope handles near the base of the basket and was therefore lifted about 20 feet into the air. As soon as the pilot realized that someone was hanging from the bottom of the basket, he began venting air from the top of the balloon in order to get the basket back on the ground. But the individual hanging from the rope handles lost his grip and fell to grassy terrain below. The injured person had extensive experience acting as a balloon ground crew member and as a passenger in a balloon. He had no memory of the event, and it could not be determined why he grabbed onto the rope handles after releasing his grip from the basket rim.

The National Transportation Safety Board determines the probable cause(s) of this accident as follows: The balloon ground crew member's decision to not release his hold on the basket of an ascending hot air balloon basket as it lifted off of the ground.
