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NTSB Reports

The following reports were provided by Rob Bartholomew for review & educational purposes. Full reports can be found on the NTSB Web site: www.ntsb.gov under "Accident Reports".

NTSB Identification: DEN04CA072

On May 22, 2004, at 0800 mountain daylight time, a Lindstrand 180A hot air balloon, N60181, operated by the Bighorn Balloon Company, LLC, encountered gusting wind conditions during landing near Ridgeway, Colorado. The balloon was dragged and subsequently struck vehicles and a house before coming to rest at the bottom of a hill. One of the six passengers on board sustained a serious back injury. Two passengers sustained minor injuries. The commercial pilot and three other passengers on board the balloon were not injured. The sight-seeing flight was operating under the provisions of Title 14 CFR Part 91. Visual meteorological conditions prevailed at the time of the accident. The local flight departed at 0700.

In his written statement, the pilot reported that while landing the wind changed directions taking his balloon up a slight draw between houses. The pilot said he elected to land on a hillside and wait for his crew. The pilot said they had been there for about a minute when a sudden gust of wind came up the draw and pushed the balloon in the air. The pilot said the balloon headed east toward a house at a rapid rate. He said the basket struck a boat, a ladder rack on a truck, and the edge of the roof of the house. The balloon then returned to the ground and was drug up a hill to its crest. At the crest of the hill the balloon again became airborne. The balloon again came down, this time on a road. The balloon then bounced down the hillside before dragging the basket on its side for a short distance. The pilot said the balloon then came to rest and deflated.

In an interview statement, the pilot said that when the balloon crested the hill, it then "caught a rotor on the backside" and dropped into a bowl. The pilot said he ripped out the top. The balloon struck the ground at the bottom of the hill and stopped. The pilot said the seriously injured passenger, on getting down in the basket, sat down hard. The pilot said the bottom of the basket sustained minor damage. The balloon envelope experienced some ripped panels.

A local Marshall said that the balloon was part of festival that was going on at Ridgeway. He said the balloon was one of 12 balloons that took off about 0700. He said the balloons drifted north over the town at approximately 300 feet above the ground. The Marshall said the winds were calm when the balloons took off. He said the winds picked up significantly as the hour passed.

NTSB Identification: NYC04CA128

On May 23, 2004, about 1900 eastern daylight time, a Cameron Balloons N90, N6123U, sustained minor damage while landing in Whately, Massachusetts. The certificated commercial pilot and three passengers were not injured,

while one passenger sustained a serious injury. Visual meteorological conditions prevailed for the flight that departed Conway, Massachusetts, about 1800. No flight plan was filed for the sightseeing flight conducted under 14 CFR Part 91.

The pilot reported that the surface winds were very light during takeoff; however, the wind velocity increased during the flight. Due to the increased wind velocity, the pilot located an open field to land the balloon. During the approach, windshear drove the balloon into trees. The balloon then became entangled in trees about 10 feet agl. A tree limb subsequently broke, and the balloon fell to the ground. During the fall, a passenger suffered a fractured leg.

The reported weather at an airport approximately 20 miles south of the accident site, at 1853, was: wind variable at 4 knots; ceiling 4,900 feet overcast; temperature 73 degrees F; dew point 66 degrees F; altimeter 29.83 inches Hg; remark lightning in the distance to the south and southwest.

The reported weather at an airport approximately 20 miles northeast of the accident site, at 1852, was: wind variable at 6 knots; ceiling 11,000 feet overcast; temperature 68 degrees F; dew point 60 degrees F; altimeter 29.88 inches Hg.

NTSB Identification: SEA04CA109

On June 17, 2004, about 0715 Pacific daylight time, a Balloon Works Fire Fly 9 balloon, N3097R, collided with terrain while landing near Aurora, Oregon. The balloon is registered to the pilot and was being operated under the provisions of Title 14, CFR Part 91, when the accident occurred. Of the seven people aboard (pilot plus 6 passengers), the certificated commercial pilot and one passenger sustained serious injuries, another passenger received minor injures, and the remaining four passengers were not injured. Visual meteorological conditions prevailed, and no flight plan was filed for the local flight. The flight originated at Tigard, Oregon, approximately 1 hour prior to the accident.

In a written statement provided to the National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB), the pilot reported that after about one hour of flight he "...came down to the surface to set up for a landing." He stated the winds were greater than expected (estimated to be 10-12 MPH) and prepared for a high wind landing. The pilot stated that during the landing approach the basket "...impacted land and dragged approximately 30-40 yards before coming to a stop" on its side.

Also includes a 1999 Kiefer Kargo King 6 x 10 enclosed trailer completely customized for hot air ballooning including internal pressurized system, helium tank with holder, jack with holder, first-aid kit, took kit, gloves, storage cabinet, tongue lock, fire extinguisher, spare tire and extra wide side door.

All our annuals have been performed by Rob and Linda Bartholomew with Balloons Over Iowa, Carlisle, Iowa.

Heat Tape Information

Spring is here! Ballooning Season is here! It's time for some basket cleaning. Those of you who have heat tapes on your tanks – you need to take the time to remove & clean your tank covers. While they are off, check your heat tapes. We have found several that have actually been arcing on the tanks. Those of you who have tank covers with built-in heat tapes need to check the inside of the cover. We had one that actually burnt the liner. If you find this, remove them immediately. When re-installing your tanks, make sure your hoses are clear of anything that may cause abrasion.

Linda & Jen said they are required to check the tanks every 5 years. They recommend that pilots remove the tanks yearly when they clean the basket. Make sure that the tapes do not touch.

High Adventure in the Badlands By Sam Blackburn

Last September I was lucky enough to get a call from John Boulger in Fargo inviting Deb and me to a little rally in Medora, ND. Medora is one of the "gateways" into the Theodore Roosevelt National Park, situated on I-94 about 20 miles from the Montana border and right smack in the middle of the North Dakota Badlands.

The ND badlands are very rugged and in a lot of areas, completely inaccessible. So, once you're out over them, you're committed to flying until you're back out of them. Anything in between and you're going to have to hike out and hire a helicopter to get your balloon back. Sound intimidating? It is, but with some careful planning and John's experience with the area, the intimidation factor was reduced to pure excitement.

Medora is a tiny little town dotted with small gift shops and restaurants. You can walk from one end to the other in 10 minutes. Be that as it may, our launch site was literally right outside our motel room door. I could get used to that! There was just enough room for the six of us to lay out and inflate. The little park was well protected, nestled between two motel buildings and a large bluff extending upward several hundred feet.

Saturday morning, we awoke to a picture perfect, crystal clear morning. We all rounded up our passengers and set to launching our balloons. As we

rose out of our protected site and above the bluff, the full grandeur of the area reached out and smacked us all in the eyeballs. The vastness of these rugged lands is indescribably impressive.

We all flew close together as we dropped into ravines and slipped over peaks. Our crews were led by locals in one big caravan. At one point during the flight, Vern Feekes, Duane Waack and I flew along in a clump, all three envelopes touching. After an hour and 20 minutes of the coolest contour flying I've ever done, we all landed within a quarter mile of each other along the same road...the ONLY road.

Sunday morning began much like Saturday, the difference being in the

wind direction. We decided to drive 10-12 miles south of Medora to the Iron Cross Ranch, formerly owned by Theodore Roosevelt. We launched out of a large hay field and flew into a very different type of terrain, much more rugged than the day before. This was shaping up to be a real adventure. The wind was a bit more brisk than the day before so we all got spread out quickly. Vern, Duane and I managed to stay in the same "neighborhood" but the crews were nowhere to be seen. Not surprising as there were no roads to be seen either!

After an hour of flight, we exited the ruggedness and entered the oilfields. There were roads all over the place, servicing the many oil rigs, a veritable maze of dirt paths snaking all over. Fortunately for everyone, the local volunteer firemen were along again, guiding the crews where they needed to be and everyone was located and packed up without a hitch.

Flying the ND Badlands was exhilarating, exciting and just plain fun. I can almost hear them beckoning now and there is little doubt that they'll lure me back again and again. Wild and rugged, yet beautiful and inviting.

Request for Change of Certificate Number

I wanted to let you know that you have two options for changing your pilot certificate number to a unique number. These changes can be accomplished easily with the FAA.

Option 1 - FAA form AFS.760-Exam-01 (Request for Change of Certificate Number) This form is attached - see page 14. As you will see on the form, it is designed specifically to change from a Social Security Number ID to a unique Pilot #. There is NO CHARGE for this change.

O p t i o n 2 - G o O n l i n e a t : http://www.faa.gov/licenses_certificates There are a couple of steps but it is easy. First they require that you create a user's account. The return email with your password is almost instantaneous. Then look for the "Replace a License (Certificate)" choice. You can then complete the form on-line. For a cost of \$2, you can get the new Pilot Certificate that has the Wright Brothers background and is a credit-card type card. Much better format in case you run your pilot certificate thru the laundry. Those paper ones get a little ragged around the edge after the spin cycle.

The only negative is that the replacement certificate will have a 2005 date of issue. The FAA has no option to update the number AND keep your original issue date (which reflects your last pilot rating addition or change).

Federal Aviation Administration DUI/DWI Program Reporting Requirements

Under 14 CFR 61.15, all pilots are required to submit a notification letter to AMC-700, within 60 calendar days of the effective date of an alcohol-related conviction or administrative action. For purposes of 14 CFR 61.15©, alcohol-related convictions or administrative actions are referred to as motor vehicle actions (MVA).

An administrative action consists of a suspension, cancellation, or revocation of a driver license. Examples of administrative actions include a suspension, cancellation, or revocation of a driver license for driving with an excessive blood alcohol level or refusal to submit to a chemical or blood test. Airmen should be aware that the nature and duration of administrative actions varies among the states.

For instance, some states, such as North Carolina, provide for a 10-day civil revocation for refusing to test. Other states may impose a lengthy suspension (e.g. 90 - 180 days) for a similar violation.

It is important to note that a separate notification letter is required for each action (e.g. conviction or administrative action). For example, many times an airman's driver license will be suspended at the time of arrest for driving under the influence of alcohol. At this point the airman should submit a notification letter regarding the driver license suspension. At a later date if the airman receives an alcohol-related conviction, then a second notification letter is required. This situation is ultimately viewed as one alcohol-related incident even though two notification letters are submitted, since the suspension and conviction arose out of the same incident.

Requirements for a notification letter are stated in 14 CFR 61.15(e). Provide a written report of each MVA to the FAA within f the effective date of the MVA.

The report must include the following information:

- 1) the person's name, address, date of birth, and airman certificate number;
- 2) the type of violation that resulted in the conviction or the administrative action;
- 3) the date of the conviction or administrative action;
- 4) the state that holds the record of conviction or administrative action; and
- 5) a statement of whether the motor vehicle action resulted from the same incident or arose out of the same factual circumstances related to a previously-reported motor vehicle action.

Optional information you may include in the written report to enhance the efficiency of processing:

- 1) driver license number;
- 2) social security number if different from airman certificate number;
- 3) daytime telephone number.
